



Standard samples

A standard sample is a sample of grain that represents the minimum visual quality for a specific grade of grain. After a Canadian Grain Commission inspector has inspected your sample, we may ask you for another sample so we can prepare standard samples for this crop year.

If you agree to take part, we'll

- send you two bags to fill and return. Each bag holds about 20 kilograms of grain
- cover shipping costs
- pay you for the grain you send (\$20/bag for pulses, \$10/bag all other grains)
- send you a certificate for a free grade and protein assessment at any Canadian Grain Commission service centre (located in Saskatoon, SK; Weyburn, SK and Calgary, AB)

Important dates

November 30, 2021	Please mail your samples by this date.
December 31, 2021	We won't inspect or analyze samples received after this date.
April 1, 2022	Last day to get your results online. After this date, you'll have to contact us by phone or email.

Did you know?

- Five varieties of Canada Western Red Spring wheat will move to the Canada Northern Hard Red wheat class on August 1, 2021. These are AAC Redwater, AC Domain, Muchmore, Vesper and 5605 HR CL.
- We are now accepting canary seed samples! Canary seed will be a designated grain under the Canada Grain Act effective August 1, 2021.
- We now offer DON results for wheat, corn and barley.



Harvest Sample Program Instructions

Record your sample numbers

Before you send your sample, record your seven-digit harvest sample number, which you can find on the back of each sample envelope. This is unique to each sample and is different from your producer identification number.

Decide on your own identification system for your samples, such as growing location or bin number. Record and keep this on file.

Take a representative sample

The grade, dockage, moisture and protein of your grain can vary within a field, bin and from truckload to truckload. Proper sampling, mixing and dividing procedures will help ensure the sample taken accurately represents your grain's quality.

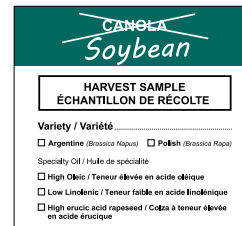
Your samples are used to generate crop quality data to facilitate the sale of Canadian grain. To best reflect the quality you produced, send us samples which are representative of the crop you have just harvested.

Submit your samples

Step 1. Complete information on envelope

- If you received an envelope for a commodity you didn't grow this year, cross out the commodity name and write the name of the commodity you are sending in the white space on the envelope.



Step 2. Pour grain sample into envelope

- Pour a representative 800-gram sample of your grain up to the "fill" line printed on the inside of the envelope.

Step 3. Remove backing paper from envelope

Step 4. Seal the envelope

Step 5. Mail

- Mail us your sample(s) as soon as you finish harvesting your crop or before November 30.

How to get your results

Your results will be available within 20 business days of the Canadian Grain Commission receiving your sample. **There are 5 ways to get your results.**

1. By email

- An automated report will be sent directly to your email address.
- Add harvest-recolte@grainscanada.gc.ca to your contacts to prevent delays and check your junk mail folder in case your email's filters sent our reports there.

2. Online at grainscanada.gc.ca/hsp

• Creating a new account

If you have never accessed your Harvest Sample Program results online before, you must create an online services account. You can then link it to your Harvest Sample Program account by entering your producer identification number and your first and last name.

• Log into your existing account

If you created your online Harvest Sample Program results account before December 2019, log in using your producer identification number or email. You'll be prompted to reset your password.
